

# DOES REFUGE HELP LEADERS

# **GET HEALTHIER AND ENDURE?**

75% of all Guests come to Refuge struggling with an issue that could take them out of ministry. Refuge surveyed 556 Guests between the ages of 19 and 74 who went on a trip from 2018-2021 to understand their experience. Here are the key findings of what Guests reported.






# WHERE GUESTS LIVE

### COMBINED HOUSEHOLD INCOME


73% of marketplace Guests and 34% of Pastors had household income above \$145K per year



# WHAT CRISIS COULD END GUEST MINISTRY?


Data presented below is based on survey data from 406 Refuge Guests in full-time ministry and ministry-focused marketplace leaders

81% of all ministry-focused Guests come to Refuge struggling with an issue that could take them out of ministry. Pressures on pastors push almost half to consider quitting ministry.







# **HOW ARE GUESTS IMPACTED?**


Data presented below is based on survey data from 406 Refuge Guests in full-time ministry and ministry-focused marketplace leaders






# MINISTRY & MARKETPLACE LEADERS

Data presented below is based on survey data from 406 Refuge Guests in full-time ministry and ministry-focused marketplace leaders

Ministry leaders need Refuge more. Ministry leaders are more isolated and overwhelmed. Although a few more marketplace leaders actually see greater improvements because they have a greater need for the things Refuge points Guests towards.


## HIGHER RATES OF PASTORAL BURNOUT

Protestant Pastors at Refuge seriously consider quitting more than the national average



## MINISTRY LEADERS FEEL MORE ALONE

65% of pastors reported feeling lonely and isolated frequently or sometimes in the last 3 months, up from 57% for ministry workers and 49% for marketplace leaders




# **VOCATIONAL MINISTERS NEED REFUGE MORE**

81% of ministry leaders face struggles that could take them out of ministry vs. 67% for marketplace leaders




## MARKETPLACE LEADERS EMBRACE THE MODEL

Vocational ministry leaders need more help with mental and organization health, while marketplace leaders need more help in their marriage, physical & spiritual health






# **ROLE OF FRIENDSHIPS**

Data presented below is based on survey data from 406 Refuge Guests in full-time ministry and ministry-focused marketplace leaders

70% formed close friendships where they could share openly and honestly about their deepest struggles and dreams. Factors like the depth and frequency of communication coupled with 1-on-1 meet-ups after the trip led to greater impact.

### **VULNERABILITY FORMS FRIENDSHIPS**

Quality of friendships increases when Guests move from not vulnerable (37%) to vulnerable (38%) to deeply vulnerable (25%). Vulnerable is defined as having any conversation only among Refuge friends. Deeply vulnerable is defined as having difficult conversations only among Refuge friends.



# **VULNERABILITY INCREASES IMPACT**

Creating a safe space is key for Guests to be open and honest. 50% have conversations about topics they don't share with anyone else

Not Vulnerable		Deeply Vulnerable
5%	I no longer have feelings of anxiety and depression	28%
3%	My marriage is no longer headed to divorce	9%
7%	I no longer feel isolated from my family	15%

### KEEPING IN COMMUNICATION AFTER A TRIP

More frequent communication allows Guests to experience more impact from friendships. After the trip, 24% of Guests rarely/never stay in contact, 45% are in regular communication (every month or two), and 31% are in frequent communication (every week or more)

# MEETING 1-ON-1 AFTER A TRIP

53% met up 1-on-1 after the trip

### VULNERABILITY + IN PERSON = GREATEST IMPACT

Guests who created deep and lasting friendships (met in person and also had difficult conversations) outperformed in nearly every outcome measurement


# 1 Trip vs. 2+ Trips

# MORE TRIPS = MORE FRIENDSHIPS


Returning Guests are 2x more likely to have a greater depth of friendships because of Refuge

### MORE TRIPS = MORE CLARITY

Guests gain more clarity on what areas they need to address and the next steps to take with more trips to rest and reflect
